OCEAN REPORT DISCUSSION

Rising surf & changing conditions as a new Northwest swell builds this afternoon to advisory levels by Friday. South winds & potential for more rain. Winds shifting East this weekend. Brown water advisory at many Kauai beaches. Calmest on South facing shores. Always use caution - esp. when unfamiliar and help is a long way away. Recommended lifeguarded beaches: Kee, Hanalei Pavilion, Poipu, Salt Pond.

Outlook to Thurs March 26: active Northwest swell pattern through this weekend. Strengthening Easterly tradewinds & choppy wind-swell.

SAFETY TIPS

- SWIM AT LIFEGUARDED BEACHES ask lifeguards for safety and swimming tips.
- CONDITIONS CONSTANTLY CHANGE daily and seasonal changes must be monitored closely.
- WAVES COME IN SETS it can look calm for up to 20 minutes between dangerous sets of huge waves.
- HAZARDS CAN EXIST IN ANY COASTAL AREA, not just in the water. Be careful on wet sand and rocks.
- DO NOT FIGHT A RIP CURRENT if caught in a current keep calm, float, breathe, don't panic, and wait for help. Go WITH the current and conserve energy.
- Use the BUDDY SYSTEM never swim alone
- WHEN IN DOUBT DON'T GO OUT! Know your limits!

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
